Note 1: The proximity of these markers to Segments 18 suggest they may be associated with markers in that Segment. They do not appear to be associated with other markers in Segment 12.

Note 2: The grave marker has a place left in anticipation of the death of Robert G. Lambert, but no date has been inscribed. This begs the question as to whether he has died, and if so, was he buried elsewhere or buried here without the inscription being completed?

Note 3: Parker indentified the marker at Site 16 as also for Dudley Lambert, a son of Robert Lambert. Dudley's name does not appear on the marker. Quite possibly the marker nearby at Site 24 is that of Dudley Lambert.

Note 4: Parker previously identified a marker for George Treat. Her numbering plan would make it appear that it was located next to Samuel Clark Griddle i.e., the Whitestone Fragment found at Site 12-21.

Note 5: Parker previously identified markers in this area for Elizabeth and Sarah Johnson, sisters of James D. Johnson, whose displaced marker was found at Site 12-23. It is quite possible that the illegible Whitestone Marker and Stub found at Site 12-22 belong to one or the other of James D. Johnson's sisters.

Note 6: The numbering sequence of Parker's Survey suggests the possibility that the unidentified markers at Sites 10-12 might include those of Isaac A. Blauvelt and his 1st Wife Sarah A. Blauvelt.
