Note: The numbering sequence of Parker's Survey suggest the possibility that the unidentified markers at Sites 10-12 might include those of William Coburn, his Wife Harriet H. (Shelley) Coburn, and Mahlon Pierson. The Sites also could be the graves of Phebe Pierson, Lucretia A. Rogers Wilkinson, and her daughters Eliza and Sarah. The numbering sequence also suggests the possibility that William Lindsley was interred near members of the Elmer family, but there is no evidence of another grave in the vicinity in 2000.
