



From all of us on the Outreach Committee, thank you, thank you, to PCM members and our youth groups for such generous donations to the Table of Hope Donation Drive. Your commitment to this annual donation drive yielded the following and we are deeply grateful: 190 contractor size trash bags, 530 pairs of vinyl gloves, 500 to go containers, 2,440 plastic forks, 3,150 sandwich bags, 15 foil pans, six commercial size aluminum foil rolls, and 11 bottles of dishwashing soap. A Note from Jeanne Mueller, Director of Presbyterian Church Nursery School





The 2022/23 school year at PCNS got off to a wonderful and cool start. We begin by expressing our sincere thanks to the congregation of the Presbyterian Church in Morristown ("PCM") for their generous support with the \$50,000 from the 2021 Stewardship campaign. These funds allowed us to add much needed air conditioning to Classrooms 1 and 2 in the back of the Parish House.

Traditionally, August, September, May and June are extremely uncomfortable months in these rooms. The AC has allowed teachers to work comfortably during the summer to arrange beautiful classrooms, and our students are able to enjoy a nice cool classroom while they adjust to a new school year. We hope to be able to provide a summer camp next year here at PCNS. The addition of the air conditioning has made that possible.

The Stewardship funds raised also allowed the school to update the soft surfacing for our playground - a large annual expense, some new furnishings, and educational toys in Rooms 1, 2 and 3. The PCNS staff is so grateful for these improvements and additions to the environment here in our school. More of the funds will be held for scholarships for future students in need. A very heartfelt THANK YOU to the generous congregants of PCM!



Our school community is mourning the sudden loss of our dear Advisory Chair, Vicky Willson. She was the leader of our committee, a champion for all teachers and a cheerleader for PCNS families and students. Vicky's kindness, enthusiasm, friendship and support will be sorely missed. We paid tribute to this irreplaceable spirit on October 1st at her memorial service.

PRESBYTERIAN HAPPENINGS & INFORMATION

The General Assembly met in person for the first time in four years. It was a hybrid meeting with the theme, "From Lament to Hope." Over three weeks the GA commissioners met online for the plenary sessions and committees met in newly renovated space at the PC(USA)'s national offices in Louisville. Masks and Covid-19 vaccinations were required. The business this year reflects policy concerns from racism to gun violence to global warming as well as internal issues such as declining membership and a growing number of small but faithful congregations.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS: CONTINUED

PRESBYTERIAN HAPPENINGS & INFORMATION:

Climate Change: The Committee on Mission Responsibility Through Investment (MRTI) recommended divestment from fossil fuel companies. (Overture: Hudson River Presbytery).

Racism: There is a committee devoted specifically to issues of race and gender justice, including a report from the Special Committee on Racism Truth and Reconciliation which calls for more work to be done to "explore and expose where White supremacy is embedded institutionally and foundationally" in the PC(USA) and encourages congregations to investigate their own histories involving people of color. An overture from the Presbytery of Giddings-Lovejoy calls for the PC(USA) to apologize to African Americans "for the sin of slavery and its legacy." There is also a report the committee will consider from the Disparities Experienced by Black Women and Girls Task Force.

Israel/Palestine: An overture from Grace Presbytery seeks to declare the Israel's policies, laws, and practice regarding the Palestinian people amount to apartheid. GA Stated Clerk J. Herbert Nelson's comment described Israel's occupation of Palestinian territories as "21" century slavery."

Financial Sustainability: The Special Committee on Per-Capita-based Funding and National Church Financial Church Sustainability is considering what structure and funding systems are needed for a denomination that's half the size it was 20 years ago.

Gun Violence: An assembly committee on Addressing Violence in the USA will consider overtures calling for the PC(USA) to support tighter gun control, including universal background checks before firearms can be purchased and a ban on the sale and ownership of assault weapons. The Advisory Committee on Social Witness Policy wants the assembly to approve the "Decade to End Gun Violence," a 10-year campaign from 2022 to 2032 "to be conducted at all levels of the church."

Denominational matters: Issues to be considered: a proposed amendment to the PC(USA) constitution to require that the minimum terms of call for all ministers would include 12 weeks of paid family medical leave, several recommendations to write new confessions for the PC(USA) and measures seeking to provide more flexibility for new worshipping communities and immigrant congregations in allowing their leaders to become ruling elders with voice and vote at presbytery.

Leadership: Newly elected co-moderators: Shavon Starling-Louis (Charlotte Presbytery) & Ruth Santana-Grace (Presbytery of Philadelphia) - both are ministers.
