## A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

As pandemic edges closer toward endemic in our world, we continue to flesh out what dayto-day life looks like. For some, merely walking around without a mask is a major event, while others find themselves annoyed by the limitations that stand between them and their freedom to masklessly go and do as they wish. As I have conversations with our parishioners each week, many of them say "we'll never get back to where we were before." For a while I found this frustrating because I saw it as a sign of defeat. Even when I began forming this article, I found myself giving in to the idea that "we'll never get back to where we were before." Then something clicked: I don't want to go back to the way that we were before.

While our church has seen almost 300 years of life in this community, encompassing many great moments as a community of faith, the best could very well be yet to come. I don't want to go back to the way that we were before because I want to see us move above and beyond the adversities that we have faced in the past two years with COVID and in the half-decade of steady decline past in engagement. We are a congregation eagerly awaiting the calling of two new ministers, blessed as caretakers of two nineteenthcentury buildings, all while being under our goal for financial giving. We are not seeing the same numbers of people coming to worship on Sunday mornings. We don't have the same numbers of youth and children attending our wonderful programs. Considering these challenges, it would be very easy for us to throw our hands up in the air and say, "We give up."

Or we could say what it is that we want as a congregation, strategically plan a way forward, as any good Presbyterian would, and be blessed by what happens when we are a congregation whose vision extends beyond the walls of our buildings.

I have an app on my phone called "I Am." It sends me short, sentence-long empowering messages throughout the day. Recently I got one that said, "To get something that I've never had, I must do something that I've never done." This statement could be seen as a corollary to our theological axiom, "Reformed and always reforming." If we truly are Reformed, sacramental people of the Word, we must learn to be nimble and ready to pivot. We must move beyond the idea that people will begin to magically fill our pews of their own accord or even if we ask them multiple times. "The church is still here, please come back to us." That is clearly what we would love to see happen, but we must be a relational people, meeting people where they are, sowing seeds of God's boundless love.

Are we called to be the Church only when we have an installed Senior Minister? Are we called to be the Church only when our giving meets the level of our expenditures? I really don't think that we are called to be the Church when we feel most comfortable or when it suits us emotionally. Being a Christian or a Matthew 25 church has never been a fade-into-the background, findthe-place-of-greatest-comfort proposition. Being a Christian involves wading into and existing in a place of discomfort. It means asking the hard questions about racial, gender, and financial equity; about being able to coexist with people who are more conservative than we are; about sharing the pew, the pulpit, and the restroom with someone who is transgender. Being the Church is about literally welcoming all people, a truly radical proposition.

I'm not sure whether we were a place of radical welcome before March 15, 2020, but we can be unbelievably welcoming for the rest of 2022, and every day after that. Jesus says in John 15, "This is my commandment that you love one another as I have loved you." That means loving when it feels good to love, when it doesn't feel good to love, and when we think we can't possibly find a way to love."

So, let's not try to "go back to where we were before." Let's go somewhere greater; somewhere more accepting; somewhere more giving; somewhere more loving; somewhere where we try things that we've never done before.

Let's go be the Church.

It is a great summer for our youth ministry! We are thrilled to return to RISE July 10th - 16th to work with our friends in Friendship, NY. We have 9 students led by Jason Lawlor, Kimberley Davies, and Ken Clark ready to make two homes warmer, safer, and dryer. Please pray for us as we share the love of Christ with our neighbors that week. Presbyterian Youth Triennium, a staple youth event of the PCUSA, was cancelled this year due to travel and housing complications stemming from the ongoing COVID-19 The Youth Formation pandemic. Committee with Highlands Presbytery quickly pivoted and is hosting a Social Justice Retreat for students across New Jersey that replaces Triennium.



Students will have the opportunity to discuss and hear about critical issues related to social justice and how those issues should coincide with our faith. This is in addition to the great amenities that we know and love at Camp Johnsonburg.

Lastly, the Youth Formation Committee with Highlands Presbytery is hosting a youth leaders retreat on August 28th at Camp Johnsonburg. This retreat will give current youth leaders a chance to reconnect with other youth leaders in the area, discuss what they have planned for their upcoming program year, and have a wonderful place to retreat to for an afternoon.

### NOTES FROM THE PRESBYTERY

Two Administrative Commissions have completed their work:

Dissolution of the Martinsville Presbyterian Church (its members now attending the Bound Brook Church)

Pompton Valley Church sold its property to another Christian denomination. With some of the proceeds from the sale, **Highlands Presbytery is contributing \$100,000 to Johnsonburg Camp and Retreat Center for its capital campaign** and another \$100K is being used for technology resources and support, to enable congregations to develop and enhance their online worship presence.

## OUTREACH

Thanks to you, the Presbyterian Church in Morristown has **collected nearly \$10,000** for the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Fund of the Presbyterian Church USA to go directly to refugees of the current Ukrainian war. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) – Ukraine has trusted partners with a presence in eastern Europe who can work with people in local church congregations and with agencies in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland, and Romania.



We asked you to scour your shelves: YOU DID! We asked you to raid your pantry: YOU DID! We asked you to run to the store: YOU DID! Lastly, we asked you to be generous with financial contributions: YOU WERE!

By this date, Outreach has collected over \$2,045.00 for the Interfaith Food Pantry Network Food Drive (more than has ever been donated before) as well as 509 pounds of food, also an excellent number. The Pantry was so grateful as are we.



Morris Area Together is exploring changes we can enact that will move our communities from where and what they are now to what they can be for ALL of us. There are many more voices with whom we want to engage.



## SAFETY MINISTRY



#### The Safety Ministry Team sends our best wishes to you and your family!

Now that we are meeting 'in person' more regularly, we wanted to bring your attention to several security and safety enhancements that have been implemented at PCM.

• Video surveillance cameras have been installed on both campuses. External cameras cover the parking lots and entrances. Internal cameras cover the Parish House hallways, the Howard House entrance foyer, and Mutch Hall.

• Electronic door locks on entrances controlled by the Open Path System are now supplemented with open door alert capability. This technology automatically notifies our Director of Administration, when doors are left open.

• Motion detection technology (including lighting) is installed in the Parish House playground.

These provide the capability to monitor activity remotely and follow on any security issues that might occur.

We ask your help in assuring that doors are closed behind you when entering a building. There have been situations in the past where doors have been propped open allowing unauthorized visitors to enter.

In addition, cardiac defibrillators (AEDs) are now in 4 locations: the COG Narthex, Mutch Hall, the Parish House first floor (outside the kitchen) and second floor (in South Street Hall).
