

BUILDING BRIDGES ACROSS CULTURES: RAMP IN ACTION

Members of PCM continue to work with a family from Afghanistan, who were resettled in Boonton in December 2022. Marnie Kaller provides English as a Second Language instruction one day a week. She is one of a team of five people who are helping the head of household, Bakht Awar Mohammadi, with English lessons every weekday morning. Anne Dodd and Janet Foster serve as weekly drivers to help the family food shop and do other errands. Friendships are forged in the process, and it has been a delight to make connections to the family. Their son, Omid, is finishing summer school and getting caught up to his grade level at Boonton High School. He will be a sophomore in the fall. He is very talented in math and science and has taken to those subjects very well.

The Mohammadi's came to Morris County under the sponsorship of RAMP (Refugee Assistance Morris Partners). It is a largely volunteer organization that partners with churches, synagogues, and other community groups to help refugees resettle here. The families that RAMP supports are fully vetted by the US State Department before they arrive, and they are legally here and on a path to citizenship and employment as their skills allow. PCM members are encouraged to volunteer to help this family or another one. There are many ways to participate, many on a schedule that you can set. If you can be a friend, speak English, and drive a car, you are able to contribute. Cash contributions to RAMP are also welcome, as RAMP pays the family's rent and other living expenses until they achieve financial independence.



FROM THE SAFETY MINISTRY TEAM

THE SAFETY MINISTRY TEAM HOPES YOU HAD A WONDERFUL SUMMER!

We want to let you know of measures in place should a medical emergency occur during Sunday worship.

The Medical Commander team was created in 2019 to include medical professionals in our congregation who are willing to take charge in the event of a medical emergency. Current team members are Chris Crean MD, Theresa Crean RN, Patty Scaduto MD, Phil Scaduto MD, and Melissa Warta MD.

A member of the team will sign in with the Welcome Team Leader at the start of the 10:00 am service. As Medical Commander, this individual will take charge should there be a medical emergency, assess the situation to determine if 911 should be called, and provide care as needed. Should such an emergency arise please allow the Medical Commander access to the person requiring attention.

In situations where no Medical Commander team member is in attendance, the Welcome Team Leader is in charge and will call 911.

We also want to remind you of the locations of our Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs). Two are located at the Church on the Green - one in the Narthex (on the wall to the left of the What's Up table) and one in Mutch Hall (on the wall opposite the Chapel entrance). Two are located at the Parish House – one in the hallway next to the kitchen entrance and one inside the entrance to South Street Hall on the left wall.

First aid kits are located at the Church on the Green (a large one in the Mutch Hall kitchen and a smaller one in the Narthex) and at the Parish House (in the first-floor hallway opposite the Conference Room door). Please see the Welcome Team Leader should you need one during worship.

If you are an MD, RN, or EMT and would like to serve on the Medical Commander team, please speak with a Welcome Team Leader at Sunday worship or a member of the Safety Ministry team.

Our team currently includes Craig Barth, Bob Davies, Karl Fenske, Kevin Hubbard, Dick Kaller, Paul Koski, Jason Lawlor, Phil Scaduto, and Jenny Tooley. Please feel free to forward any safety or securityrelated questions or concerns you may have to us.
